Three Jadeite Amulets – beautifully hand-carved, these tiny wonders come in over thirty forms, including, fish, dragons, buddhas, hexagons, rabbits, loops, hearts, fish, peaches, leaves and many more shapes. No two are alike so you'll find something unique and different in each bag.

Six Chinese Coins – easy to attach with double loops – one side of the coin has a dragon and phoenix, the other side has written Chinese characters.

Six Shell Tags – these pearly white rectangles are a lovely embellishment that can be stamped or left alone to give luster to every project.

Two Jumping Carp Pendants – the two fish jumping symbolize abundance and prosperity. The characters mean lucky, peaceful home and safety in life.

Three Dragonflies, Three Tiny Keys – these antiqued silver-color treasures add a touch of charm to projects and layouts for every season.

Three Fleur de Lis Hearts, Three Made with Love Hearts – add a little heart to everything you do.
